

Strangely enough, after calling HP compaq and learning that they no longer service MP1600 anymore nor do they sell anything but lamps, with nothing else I am willing to do or can presently do, I put everything back and try it one more time. And it worked. Color stays find for a week now, no problem whatsoever. Strange little projector. I hope your luck will be as good as mine in the projector healing itself so far at least.
